

Fresco™ Purple Brachyscome



Fresco Purple has finely textured foliage and small blue flowers that last all season long. Compact and upright-mounded plants prefer cooler temperatures. High light will produce the best habit for brighter, larger blooms than Enduring Blue, which is replaced by Brasco Violet. FRESCO is a U.S. trademark of Danziger Flower Farm.
